15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary					
<p>The following is the vision of the Institution to transform itself into a holistic multidisciplinary institution. To preserve, perpetuate and propagate academics in dance in its pristine purity at higher education. Preservation of Traditional Indian Dance Styles (Classical and Folk) by imparting training through traditional "guru - shishya - Parampara" method (teacher -taught tradition). Synthesis of ancient and concurrent trends by adapting ICT methods to traditional system of teaching. Holistic development of students by enhancing and enriching the knowledge on dance by learning its allied subjects. Many courses which are already a part of the existing curriculum will be included in an enhanced manner, in line with the vision and objectives of NEP 2020. Courses on Yoga, Fitness and Nutrition, Green Club initiatives etc. will be included in the program keeping in mind a multidisciplinary approach. This will enable students to have a holistic understanding of the program. Credit based courses will be offered under CEP eg. teaching in municipal schools as part of community outreach; Green Club initiatives, Environmental Science as part of Environmental Education; Ancient Indian Culture, Rituals, etc. as part of value based education. As part of multiple entry and exits this multidisciplinary curriculum will introduce in the first year core practical subjects and theoretical subjects, OE (Facets of Indian Culture, Indian Epics, Ancient Indian Culture), VSES (Light and Sound, Make-up), AES (English), IKS (Sanskrit), VEC (Environmental Science, Rituals), CC (Yoga). After completion of first year, students will have an exit option with the award of undergraduate certificate (44 credits). In the second year apart from the core practical subjects and theoretical subjects, this multidisciplinary</p>					

curriculum will consist of OE (Indian Dance Appreciation, Philosophy and Psychology in Indian Dance), VSC (Dance Choreography), projects DLLE and Performances and Co-curricular activities, community outreach program and Green Club Initiatives. After completion of second year, students will have an exit option with the award of undergraduate diploma (88 credits). In the third year apart from the core practical subjects and theoretical subjects, this multidisciplinary curriculum will consist of Folk Dances, VSC (Creative Writing), FP/CEP (Educational Expedition) and OJT (Internship). After completion of third year, students will have an exit option with the award of undergraduate degree (130 credits). The institution will ensure that all the above courses are geared towards finding solutions to society's most pressing issues and challenges. As a good practice of the institution to promote interdisciplinary approach, students will be encouraged to gain knowledge of dance forms other than what they have selected as mandatory.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Since autonomous institutions were required to register first, affiliated colleges will start registering as soon as the process will begin. The institution plans to prepare MOUs with other institutions. Nalanda is a member of GAAC which has collaborated with more than 20 universities, as such very soon Nalanda will have international collaboration. Since IKS is given thrust in NEP 2020, many universities are approaching Nalanda for Student - Faculty exchange programs which will be part of ABC.

17.Skill development:

This Program itself is value based and comes under IKS. The courses included will be relevant for the physical, psychological, emotional and spiritual growth of students. Languages such as English, Sanskrit; Value Educational Courses such as Ancient Indian Culture, Environmental Science; Skill Enhancement courses like Light and Sound, Make-up, Dance Choreography and Designing, Theatre, Folk Dance, Creative Writing, etc. will be included. Collaborations for courses like Make-up, Light and Sound, Theatre, Folk Dance, will be initiated. Because of the uniqueness of the program, online mode of instruction will not be conducive for Practicals. But certain theoretical courses will be offered to students through online. Many of the courses that will be introduced will help the students to upgrade their skills.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Performing Arts, itself, is relevant to IKS. Courses such as

Aesthetics, Philosophy, Natyashastra, etc. included in the Program are relevant to IKS. Through Indian Classical Dance the students will be taught to appreciate and respect Indian Culture. Although the medium of instruction at Nalanda is English, the faculties use in addition, Hindi and Marathi. The students have the option to write in English, Hindi or Marathi.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The entire course will have a holistic approach. As a part of OJT, the students will have Internship wherein they will get hands on experience at various institutions relating to Performing Arts.

20.Distance education/online education:

The institution will consider possibilities of offering courses through ODL mode in future. The institution is planning to avail advance technological tools for teaching learning activities. There are plans to increase number of smart classrooms which will add to the institution's IT facilities.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation	

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Nalanda Dance Research Centre was established in 1966 by the renowned exponent Padmabhushan Dr.(Smt) Kanak Rele. It blossomed in 1973 as Nalanda Nritya Kala Mahavidyalaya, a college of Indian Classical Dance, affiliated to the University of Mumbai. The curriculum was designed in an Annual Examination pattern until 2016. In 2016, the Choice Based Credit System was introduced, after which the prescribed course has been categorized into Core, Foundation and Electives. The Choice Based Credit System provides choice for students to select from the electives. Core courses are mandatory and must be studied to complete the requirement of a programme in a said discipline study. Foundation course is based on the core content that leads to the theoretical knowledge enhancement. Elective courses are soft skill courses that enable an exposure to some allied discipline within the course. All matters related to the curriculum are designed and discussed by the Principal and faculties and passed by the Board of Studies in dance. After wards they are passed in the Academic council and accepted by the University of Mumbai. To meet the Course outcomes & measure the academic performance of students, faculty members conduct internal assignments, projects and presentations throughout the year.

Nalanda Nritya Kala Mahavidyalaya strictly adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE). The first step that the institution formulates is the Academic calendar. This is the schedule of all the events that will occur in an academic year month wise, including examination dates, various cultural events, curricular and co-curricular activities etc. The idea behind this plan is to have a view to schedule the yearly plan in advance with the motto of achieving the goal within the guidelines. At the beginning of every academic session, the Principal convenes a meeting with the teachers to discuss the teaching plan and the academic calendar. The teachers prepare the teaching plan semester wise. This helps the teachers to

know the exact time to finish the syllabus and prepare their teaching strategies. The prescribed course formulated in the Choice Based Credit System pattern has three categories namely Core, Foundation and Elective. This gives equal importance to external and internal marks for each subject whether practical or theoretical. The marks allotted to each has the evaluation of external i.e 60 percent and internal i. e 40 percent.

1.3 - Curriculum Enrichment

1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

This is an institution dedicated to the preservation and perpetuation of the Indian Dance (Classical and Folk) in the most traditional and pristine manner.

The programmes designed in the curriculum focusses on the traditional cultural values, which integrates professional ethics,

gender, human values and environmental sustainability in the curriculum.

In the Foundation Classes subjects like History, Concept of Culture and Civilisation, Sanskrit, Epics and Technique of Dance are studied. This gives scope to the richness of Indian literature and Mythology. Irrespective of their gender the students are taught the nuances of the Indian dance styles.

The subjects like Rituals and its relation to Arts introduces the ritualistic practices and its relevance to dance. While explaining the importance of the ritualistic tradition, the students also learns the intimate relationship between man and nature.

Subjects like Natyashastra, Religion and Philosophy along with Aesthetics, centres around the idea of a religion in the socio cultural frame work. The six systems of philosophy, known as Shad darshanas inculcate the human values and ethics amongst the students. Also, the subject Environmental science provides solution for sustainable practices in nature.

Gradually the students get sensitized and learn to appreciate the beauty of art forms and nature

Admissions are taken at three levels

- Foundation - I
- Bachelor of Performing Arts - I
- Master of Performing Arts - I

With limited number of students in class, Teachers are able to identify advance and slow learners through different learning activities and evaluation methods.

Bachelor of Performing Arts (Practical + Viva) Master of Performing Arts (Practical + Viva + Written) Entrance Exam consisting Practical and Theory is conducted and hence students' learning is assessed even before the admission. Even after the admission continuous evaluation through Class tests, Quizzes, Assignment, Project, Class discussion and other different activities conducted in the classroom provide ample opportunities for teachers to identify different level learners.

The Teacher Student ratio is quite ideal in the institute 1: 10.8

This becomes the plus point of the institute because of which Personal contact with students is possible.

Teacher, Mentor teacher of the identified Student and the Counselor jointly work on the progress of the student. Accordingly, the areas of weaknesses are pointed out and efforts are taken by respective teachers.

Advanced learners are identified and given challenging tasks in learning. They are also encouraged to participate in the productions of Nalanda Dance Research Centre.

Teachers use Power Point Presentations for teaching in order to make the learning interesting and cater the needs of visual learners. The ratio of division of Internal and External Assessment is 40:60 as per the instruction of Academic Council, Board Of Studies of the University of Mumbai.

As per the need of the course and temperament of the students, activities like Debate, Role Play, PPT presentations, Choreographic presentations are assigned to the students for CIE.

The Programme expects maximum attendance of the students. Hence attendance and overall behaviour and participation in the classroom are also considered while assessing the performance of the students.

The Teacher teaching the Course never conducts the examination to avoid biased evaluation.

Orientation is given to students regarding Examination Norms and marks pattern well before examination. Revision classes are taken for practical courses.

In order to achieve transparency recording of Practical Examination is also done.

Parents Teacher Meetings are regularly held and discussion about Exam, Result, Performance of Students is done in these meetings with students and parents.

Academic calendar is prepared and displayed on the website of the institute. The schedule of Internal Assessment is included in the Academic calendar and it is followed as much as possible.
